

Subj: HONORARY CONFERRAL OF SEABEE COMBAT WARFARE DEVICE

- 1. We received a letter from one of your members requesting authorization to wear the Seabee Combat Warfare (SCW) device for Seabee veterans that either served in combat or were honorably discharged prior to 1992 when the Seabee Combat Warfare program was initiated.
- 2. The issue of grandfathering veterans to wear warfare devices is one that is occasionally raised. The CNO has been consistent in his decision to not allow this. A recent example involved a request from Vietnam-era Swift Boat veterans to be authorized to wear the Special Warfare Combatant-craft Crewmen warfare insignia. Their service preceded the establishment of the warfare device and qualification program. The CNO denied the request and stated that the warfare insignia is awarded upon completion of a qualification. Without this qualification, he thought it would be inappropriate to award the insignia. Navy leadership has indicated a similar request for Seabee Veterans to be authorized to wear the SeW device will not be supported.
- 3. The Navy recognizes and values the service of all veterans, especially ones that have fought and served in combat. However, the recognition of their service and sacrifices is best accomplished through the various existing awards and combat ribbons and not through the SeW device. We appreciate the interest shown by the many Seabee Veterans that support this, and acknowledge their point of view expressed in the letter. However, we must follow the decisions of our leaders in the Navy. We continue to be very proud of our Seabee Veterans and all that they do. We look forward to honoring them and supporting them in other ways.
